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
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Subject: Introducing the project «Universal Temple of Health & Culture in Hotel-Dieu of Paris»
Requesting a customized interview with you during an academic trip into So. California scheduled on 23
July-6 August 2014.

Distinguished gentlemen,

I'm preparing an innovative 100-minute-colloquium termed «*Hospital Museology and Museography*» to be scheduled of the 4th of August 2014 as a part of the program of InclusiveMuseum'2014 to be held in Los Angeles, California. I'm wondering whether that might be an opportunity to inform both of you on the unlimited and intensive campaign I'm leading for the transformation of the prestigious but obsolete Hotel-Dieu of Paris into a complex termed «UNIVERSAL TEMPLE AND MUSEUM OF HEALTH AND CULTURE» to be effective and operational by the end of the current decade.

An eminent French colleague and friend of mine, Dr. Laurent Alexandre, formerly urologist surgeon and founder of the successful website termed Doctissimo®, is now Founder President and CEO of genomics-oriented DNA Vision Inc., Brussels, Belgium. He has been used to inform the French scientific community on Google's projects on Intelligence Amplification and on their ethical consequences on the future of the whole humanity if they aren't regulated (ref: [LE MONDE SCIENCE ET TECHNO | 05.05.2014](http://LEMONDESCIENCE.ET.TECHNO|05.05.2014)). In a previous talk-show broadcasted in last February through France5 TV channel, Dr. Alexandre described the specificities of the respective characters of both of you founders of Goggle nicely; he put an emphasis on your generous and genuine interest in medicine and neurosciences. However, looking at the information given on Google's websites, I don't find the actual material confirmation of such Alexandre's statements. That might be partly explained by my incompetent position of pure scientist having neither the background nor the involvement in commercial ventures while I've been a skilled, but honorary treasurer of several international scientific societies.

At the moment and once gain according to Dr. Alexandre's speech added with my personal

knowledge based upon my self-investigations conducted during four decades all over the world, there aren't any existing moral person strong and invulnerable and incorruptible enough to be an unquestionable nominee to achieve such a futuristic goal yet and for a while. Even UNESCO and WHO aren't reliable: those UN bodies never work effectively both together because of the impotence of their bureaucracies.

May I introduce you myself as a potentially useful and efficient go-between catalyzing good willing IA specialists and humanist philosophers/scientists VIPs for the creation of a nurturing core group aiming to think on an ambitious but highly realistic project implementable in a given place located somewhere and interactively connected with the whole global village of the so-called «flat world» before the latter expands towards sidereal spaces with newer and huger biological needs.


I can do it because of two evidenced reasons: 1.) I've been over life used to be a successful innovative and creative congregant linking transversally multi-ethnic multi-disciplinary people; 2.) My intensive 10-year-activity in the field of the Hospital Museology applied to the history of medical and biological sciences including medical imaging and anthropology and social welfare I've studied for more then four decades non-stop.

I started last year the international promotion of both Hospital Museology as a new science and Hotel-Dieu Temple of Health & Culture as a project during InclusiveMuseum'2013 in Copenhagen. Last week, during SFHST42014 in Lyon, I packed an academic content feeding Master and Doctorate programs for francophone and anglophone and hispanophe audiences. Hotel-Dieu has become the location of the universal memory of the of the earnest humanity's fight against death, disease and misery. Thus, the huge and prestigious Hotel-Dieu built in 1870 by Haussmann should be a valuable location for such an universal Temple and Museum deserving the refreshment of the Hippocratic Oath that has to be adapted to the 3rd Millennium constraints induced by the terrific and/or terrifying outcomes of both genomics advances and spatial discoveries.

«*Nobody's prophet in his/her country*». I don't expect anything from Google France. I've always been lucky when I venture with the Americans. San Diego has become my second patry when I was twice visiting professor at the UCSD in the 80ies. My friend and Nobel Prize-awarded Dr. Roger Guillemin, pioneering neuroendocrinology at The Salk Institute in La Jolla, is supportive of my cultural undertakings and of my desire to meeting with both of you. He wrote yesterday to me: «*Meet with the founder(s) of Google: I have always wondered why were they not two young French fellows...???*». I'm ready to fly to Mountain View, a place I know very well, or where ever else at your conveniences, provided this isn't scheduled on the 4th of August and out of California. I've plentiful pptx-matter for any lecture on the topics listed on the joined-file to be given at your headquarter and/or at Stanford University. I lecture easily in both the English and the Spanish languages.

I'm naive enough to looking forward to receiving a prompt response I hope to be positive.


